7:30	Q&A with Commander Stacy Murphy and Patty Lammers, SPPD Saturday morning on 2300 block of Chisholm. Michael Brasel was shot multiple time and died stopping a car break in. Arrest made of a 17 yr. old male. Not officially charged. Likely happening tomorrow. There has been a lot of assistance from the community in that area. May not be as far along in the investigation without community support. Not a targeted crime; victim was random. Individual safety/personal safety is encouraged. Stay back if you see something, call 911, be a good witness - good description of person, vehicle. Offer full classes on personal safety. Be aware of your surroundings. 	 Stats: Generally speaking the City of St. Paul's crimes are down from 2022 (as of May 7th). Part 1 crimes (murder, rape, burglery, etc.) are down. Violent crimes are down 12% from last year. 2021-2023 SAP is pretty steady on crime. Patty Lammers can evaluate properties, give classes, etc. https://www.stpaul.gov/departments/police/administration-office-chief /community-engagement-division/community-1 Graffiti is not well reported. Not really included in the stats for that reason. Bullets fired get recorded in different ways depending on the circumstances. Uniform lighting can lower crimes by 30%. Patty can do eval. of dark areas. Crack down on street racing this summer (enforcement effort by State patrol). Helpful to stop people from congregating. Anecdotally or in the moment, call the non-emergency line to notify. Do not try to intervene yourself. Just because you are not intervening, doesn't mean you aren't taking action.
